



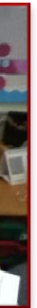

Do you have a child in school with a Developmental Language Disorder?

Are you aware of the Enhanced Resource Provision for KS1 and KS2 children with an EHCP for Developmental Language Disorder needs at Courthouse Green Primary?

Children must have an Education, Health and Care Plan and you, along with your EP and speech therapist may suggest to the local authority that a place in the ERP would suit your child's needs.

Definition of specific language impairment (SLI) now known as Developmental Language Disorder (DLD)

Children with SLI -DLD have severe, long term difficulties that maybe affected by learning, hearing and emotional difficulties but which cannot be attributed to these difficulties. Children are acquiring language in a disordered way.

- Standardised tests show language skills are at least 2 standard deviations below child's age
- Standard tests by an EP show at least 1 standard deviation below non-verbal IQ
- There are no neurological, sensory or physical impairments that directly affect spoken language
- There is no pervasive developmental disorder e.g. ASD
- Sometimes there is a mismatch between various sub systems – receptive language, expressive language, speech\phonology, pragmatics, attention and listening and auditory memory
- The child has not caught up despite targeted and specific language support.
