Our Learning

HISTORY: LEST WE FORGET

This term we will be learning about World War One and World War Two. We will learn about the lifestyle and society at the time of the British Empire and how the world wars changed lives across the world. We will hear many stories about the war, some local and some from around the world!



MATHS

This term will focus on securing knowledge and developing the following concepts:

- Place Value: Securing understanding of place value in 7 digit numbers
- Addition & Subtraction: using written methods, using numbers up to 6 digit numbers
- Multiplication & Division: using methods to multiply and divide up to 4 digits by 2 digits



WRITING

Our writing this term will link closely to History. We will write fact files and diary entries, stepping into the shoes of the people who lived in wartime. Children will be writing in joined up handwriting, using accurate spelling, punctuation and grammar, and showing their creativity through a variety of sentence types.



PSHE

This term we will focus on developing positive relationships and will be learning some strategies for developing mental and physical wellbeing.
